Introduction

About This Toolkit

The Texas Department of Family and Protective Services (DFPS) surveyed key segments of the Texas population to gauge awareness and understanding of the Baby Moses/Safe Haven Law and the Baby Moses Hotline. The research study revealed that more education is needed regarding awareness of the Baby Moses/Safe Haven Law and the Baby Moses Hotline. This toolkit contains insights and resources to help communicate the details of the Baby Moses/Safe Haven Law and how to direct community members to the Baby Moses Hotline for support.

What Is the Baby Moses/Safe Haven Law?

In Texas, the Baby Moses/Safe Haven Law gives parents a safe, legal, anonymous option to leave their unharmed infant with an employee at a designated Safe Haven within 60 days of the infant's birth. Safe Haven locations include hospitals, fire stations, 24-hour freestanding emergency centers, and emergency medical services (EMS) stations. Once the baby is surrendered, the parent(s) will not be prosecuted for abandonment or neglect. All parental rights to the surrendered child are terminated by a court of law.

What is the Baby Moses Hotline?

The Baby Moses Hotline is a confidential, judgment-free 24/7 hotline that anyone can contact to receive help from trained staff and volunteers. Hotline advocates can provide information about Safe Haven locations, discuss a parent's options including safe surrender, and share any additional resources as needed. Talking Points

Tips for Talking with an At-Risk Mother

- The tone must be non-judgmental, supportive, understanding, yet passive.
- There should be no indication that a mother is being pushed one way or another.
- She is likely isolated and needs to feel she has unconditional support from those she is speaking with about this sensitive topic.

What you can say to someone considering surrendering an infant:

- You are making the best decision for yourself and your baby.
- You have safe options available.
- It is your decision to make.
- Safe surrender under the Baby Moses/Safe Haven Law is anonymous and legal.
- The Baby Moses Hotline is completely confidential. No judgment, no legal trouble, just help.

Top Facts That May Motivate an At-Risk Mother to Use the Baby Moses/Safe Haven Law

- She can anonymously surrender her baby so that no one knows she has done it, including her parents or the baby's father.
- There are designated safe places such as hospitals, fire stations, and EMS stations to surrender her baby.
- If she follows the rules, she is at no risk of getting into legal trouble for surrendering her baby.
- Once the baby is surrendered, she no longer has any legal responsibility for the baby.

Talking Points

Explanation of the Baby Moses/Safe Haven Law in Texas

- In Texas, the Baby Moses/Safe Haven Law gives parents a safe, legal, anonymous option to leave their unharmed infant with an employee at a designated Safe Haven within 60 days of the infant's birth.
- Safe Haven locations include hospitals, fire stations, 24-hour freestanding emergency centers, and emergency medical services (EMS) stations.
- After being received, the baby will be assessed and provided medical care, and the adoption process will begin.
- Once the unharmed baby is surrendered, the parent(s) will not be prosecuted for abandonment or neglect. All parental rights to the surrendered child are relinquished by law.
- Some fire stations and hospitals have Baby Boxes in which a parent can securely surrender her baby without having to interact with staff. Boxes are climate-controlled, and first responders are notified immediately when a baby is placed inside so they can assess the child and provide care.

For Parents: How to Safely Surrender a Newborn

- Go to a Safe Haven such as a hospital, fire station, or emergency medical services (EMS) station.
- Hand the baby to staff. You need to give your baby to an employee who works at one of these safe places and tell this person that you want to surrender your baby at the Safe Haven.
- You are not required to answer any questions. Some agencies may request medical information about your baby. You are not required to provide any information. This is not an attempt to learn your identity. Any medical information will be put in your baby's records and may help answer health questions in the future.

Talking Points



What Happens After a Baby is Surrendered

- **Medical Evaluation:** The baby is transported to the hospital, given a medical evaluation, and receives any necessary care.
- **Custody Transfer:** Once the infant has been surrendered, Child Protective Services (CPS) takes custody of the child, and all parental rights will be terminated by a court of law initiating the placement process.
- **Adoption:** CPS will then start the process for placement/foster care for the child.

 - Safe Haven locations, legal details, and the surrender process.
- The hotline can also give referrals to other resources such as food banks, shelters, crisis centers, counselors, and low- or no-cost medical services.



Talking Points

Tips for Speaking with Family and Friends of At-Risk Parents

This group is more aware of the law and highly likely to refer friends and family in need to the hotline. Remind them of the existence of the Baby Moses/Safe Haven Law and Baby Moses Hotline/BabyMosesHotline.com to share with those in their lives who may need it.

When speaking with friends and family, focus on how to approach Mom with a non-judgmental, supportive, and understanding tone and help inform her about how the Baby Moses Hotline can help her with her options.

Tips for Speaking with Professionals

Awareness of the name of the Baby Moses Hotline is critical among this group. Let them know there is a hotline and website they can reach out to for more information on the Baby Moses/Safe Haven Law and what procedures to follow.

Professionals should approach at-risk mothers with an understanding tone and emphasize anonymity:

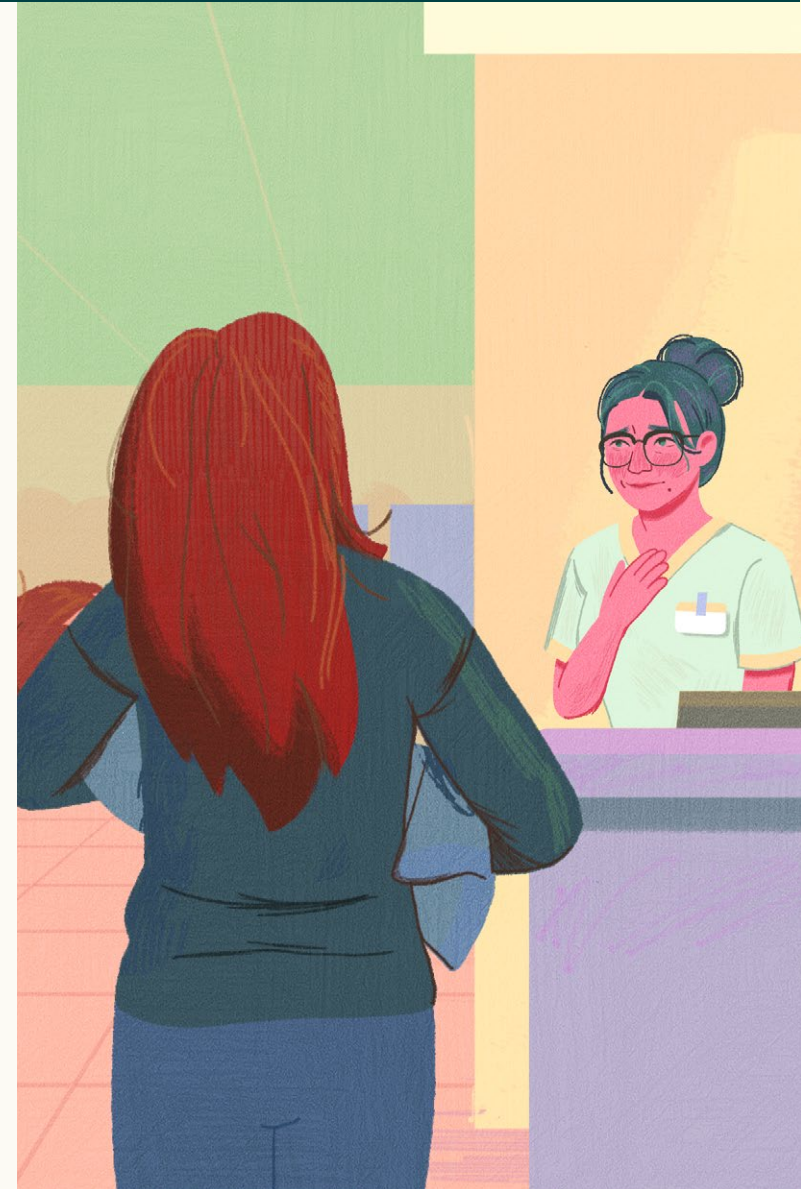

Talking Points

For Providers: Receiving a Safe Haven Surrender in Texas

Designated Emergency Infant Care Information:

- Fire stations, EMS stations, and hospitals are Designated Emergency Infant Care (DEIC) locations (i.e., Safe Haven locations) under the Safe Haven/Baby Moses Law.
- Designated Emergency Infant Care providers are responsible for accepting the child under the Safe Haven/Baby Moses Law.
- It is not the DEIC provider's responsibility to determine harm; this is the responsibility of Child Protective Services.
- The DEIC provider is required to have the child transported to a hospital, where he or she will be examined and medical care is provided.
- Once the child is at the hospital, the hospital will notify CPS through the Statewide Intake reporting line at (800) 252-5400. They will let the intake specialist know that they have a surrender under the Safe Haven/Baby Moses Law.
- CPS will take custody of the child after medical assessment.
- CPS will then start the process for placement/foster care for the child.



Frequently Asked Questions

What are designated Safe Haven locations in Texas?

Safe Haven locations include hospitals, fire stations, 24-hour freestanding emergency centers, and emergency medical services (EMS) stations. Baby Moses Hotline advocates can help someone identify and find a Safe Haven location.

Does a surrendering parent have to answer questions?

No. While a staff member may ask questions about the infant's medical history, the surrendering parent is under no legal obligation to answer any questions. Staff should not ask the parent for any personal information such as age or name.

Does a surrendering parent have to hand the infant to a staff member?

Yes. Unless a surrendering parent is using a Baby Box, she must hand the infant to a staff member at a Safe Haven location and tell the staff member that she wishes to surrender the infant.

Frequently Asked Questions

What is a Baby Box?

A Baby Box is a device designed to offer a fully anonymous and secure option to surrender a baby. Baby Boxes can be found at some fire stations and hospitals in Texas. Boxes are climate-controlled, and first responders are notified immediately when a baby is placed inside so they can assess the child and provide care. Baby Moses Hotline advocates can assist in finding a Baby Box location.

Does a parent who has surrendered an infant have legal rights to the child?

No. Once an infant is surrendered, the parent no longer has any legal rights to the child. CPS takes custody of the child until he or she is placed for adoption. Parental rights are terminated immediately upon surrender, unless the child is determined to be missing.

What happens if a parent who has surrendered an infant changes her mind and wants the child back?

If a parent who has surrendered a child decides they want the child back, they need to contact law enforcement and DFPS immediately, and seek legal advice before the court has terminated their parental rights. If the legal rights have not been terminated, they will need to go through the court system to establish parental rights. Once legal rights are terminated by the court, the parent would no longer have rights to the child.

Frequently Asked Questions

What happens after an infant is surrendered?

After surrender, the infant receives a medical evaluation and care. CPS takes custody of the child, terminating the birth parent's parental rights, and begins the process to have the child placed for adoption. A parent who leaves an unharmed infant 60 days old or younger at a Safe Haven location will not be prosecuted for abandonment or neglect.

Does a Safe Haven location incur costs?

No. Under the Baby Moses/Safe Haven Law, DFPS shall reimburse a Safe Haven location that takes possession of a child under the law for the cost to the provider of assuming the care, control, and custody of the child (during their stay).

Safe Haven

In Texas, the Baby Moses/Safe Haven law allows you to safely and legally surrender your unharmed baby within 60 days of birth at any hospital, fire station, or EMS station without fear of repercussion or questioning. The baby will then immediately receive medical care. Baby Moses Hotline advocates can help you understand your rights in the surrender process. They can also find Safe Haven locations where you can anonymously leave your infant and find other resources.

Adoption

If you are pregnant and considering offering your baby for adoption, learn about adoption services from the Texas Department of Family and Protective Services. Baby Moses Hotline advocates can refer you to an adoption specialist who can answer your questions, discuss adoption options, and help you choose a plan that best fits your situation.

Parenting Support

If you want to speak with someone about parenting, Baby Moses Hotline staff will help connect you with resources in your community including prenatal care, WIC services, parenting classes, pregnancy resource centers, and other programs to support you and your baby. You don't have to do it alone. We're here to help.

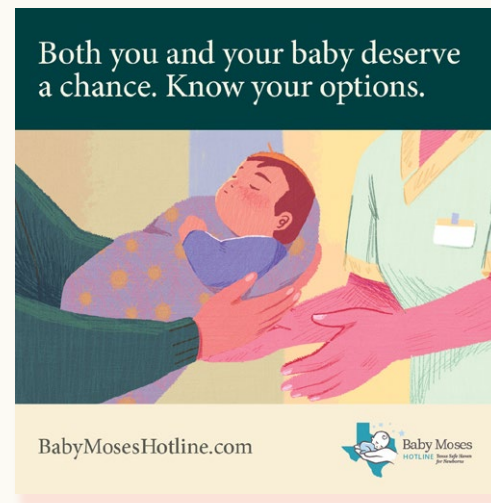
